The Islamic State pursues foreign policy within the framework of transcendent interests and on a multilateral basis; In the sense that its interests are created in the context of macro and strategic goals and at the level of human society. Given the limited capacity of the government, the importance of determining the interests and the conflict between the various interests in the implementation phase, the interests of the Islamic State are always confronted with the equations that necessitate a basic human monitoring and guidance mechanism. The direct responsibility of the government's foreign policy apparatus to pursue strategies and actions and, consequently, to create unbalanced and contradictory approaches in different governments, the emphasis of some researchers and policymakers on the responsibility of government agencies in determining policies and programs and the lack of these agencies are the necessary criteria to act on complex foreign policy issues, increases the importance of designating an organization to lead and monitor the performance of the responsible apparatus in foreign policy.
